ASPECTOS VETERINARIOS "A"

El siguiente texto deberá publicarse en los horarios y programas del evento.

INSPECCION VETERINARIA, INSPECCION DE CABALLOS Y CONTROL DE PASAPORTES.

Se llevará a cabo de acuerdo a las Regulaciones Veterinarias Art.1030 9ª Edición al 1º. de Enero 2019 y reglas de disciplina.

Los caballos extranjeros tendrán el chequeo veterinario en Las Instalaciones del Complejo Hípico Deportivo, el **día lunes 11 de febrero** a partir de las 08.00 Horas. Con el fin de evitar que los caballos tengan que ser transportados más de lo necesario, los chequeos veterinarios se harán en los clubes en el horario que se presenta a continuación.

Todos los caballos deberán tener pasaporte o reseña nacional o pasaporte aprobado por la FEI y deberá aparecer firmado por un veterinario, en la sección de vacunas, que ha recibido dos inyecciones refuerzo contra influenza equina, dejando no menos de 21 días ni más de 90 días.

Además, debe aparecer que ha recibido refuerzos dentro de los doce meses subsecuentes de la segunda inyección de la primera vacuna. Ninguna de estas vacunas deberá ser dentro de los siete días previos a la competencia o dentro de los establos de la competencia.

Lo arriba mencionado aplica igual como requisito para la vacunación contra influenza. Ambas primaria y primera y refuerzo deberán ser aplicadas de acuerdo con las instrucciones del fabricante, cuales caen bajo las reglas de la FEI. En muchos casos los refuerzos están recomendados por los fabricantes con intermedios más frecuentes que 12 meses.

MUESTREO PARA PRUEBA DE SUSTANCIAS PROHIBIDAS. Reg. Vet. Cap. V & VI y Anexo III

Guías especiales son aplicadas para eventos que cubre la FEI Medication Control Program (Grupo I y II solamente). En todos los eventos internacionales los caballos están sujetos a muestreo para prueba de sustancias prohibidas. Esta prueba es obligatoria en CHIs, la cual incluye cualquier combinación de la siguiente dos o más disciplinas (CSs, Categoría A, CSI-Ws, CCI*** CCI,**** y está recomendada para otras categorías de CHIs.

Trámite del permiso zoosanitario para la importación de equinos, se deberá presentar la documentación siguiente:

- a. Fotocopia del Certificado de Origen emitido por la Cámara de Comercio del país exportador. Se exceptúa del mismo cuando el origen de los animales sea de país Centroamericano, para lo cual debe presentar el Formulario Único Aduanero Centroamericano.
- b. Fotocopia del Certificado Zoosanitario internacional, emitido por una autoridad o entidad oficial del país exportador, en el que haga constar lo siguiente:
 - b.1 Los equinos deberán proceder de países o zonas libres de: durina, muermo o glanders, surra, lingangitis epizootica o ulcerativa, enfermedad africana de equinos, viruela equina, enfermedad de borna, meleoidosis, encefalitis japonesa, metritis contagiosa equina y otras enfermedades exóticas o emergentes, según status sanitario del país de origen o procedencia, caso contrario, el Ministerio de Agricultura, Ganadería y Alimentación a través de la Unidad de Normas y Regulaciones podrá realizar los análisis de riesgo para permitir o prohibir la importación solicitada. (El costo del respectivo ARP correrá por cuenta del interesado).
 - b.2 Los ejemplares son originarios del país exportador y en un radio de 15 Km. No se han presentado manifestaciones clínicas de enfermedades contagiosas o transmisibles de tipo cuarentenario que afecten a la especie en los mismos 120 días previos a la fecha de embarque.
 - b.3 Proceden de un país, área, finca o establecimiento donde 90 días previos a su embarque no se ha reportado en el área ningún caso de Piroplasmosis, Anemia Infecciosa Equina, Encefalitis Equina Venezolana, Estomatitis Vesicular, Rabia, Salmonella Abortus y Leptospirosis.
 - b.4 Los animales deben ser diagnosticados negativos a las pruebas de Brucelosis (aglutinación rápida en placa mediante antígeno BAPA o ROSA DE BENGALA con tapón modificado). Anemia Infecciosa Equina (Prueba de Coggins) y Piroplasmosis (Protis Sanguíneo)
 - b.5 Los animales deben ser inspeccionados al momento del embarque, no debiendo mostrar signos clínicos de alguna enfermedad, tumores, heridas frescas o en proceso de cicatrización, presencia de ectoparásitos, laminitis.

- b.6 Los animales deberán estar identificados en forma individual con su respectivo pasaporte FEI, permaneciendo en observación y aislamiento de otros animales bajo supervisión oficial durante un período de 30 días previo su embarque.
- b.7 Quince días antes de la fecha de embarque del animal o de los animales, fueron tratados, con productos autorizados en el país de origen contra Endo y Ectoparásitos.
- b.8 En los 30 días previo al embarque no recibieron ningún tratamiento terapéutico, ni inmunogeno.
- b.9 Vacuna contra Influenza Equina y Rhinoneumonitis (cero Tipos A Equi .1 y A equi 2) indicándose fecha de inmunización, marco del producto utilizado y lote. (Dicha vacunación no debe tener más de 180 días de aplicación) Vacuna contra Encefalomielitis Equina Venezolana TC 83 también no mayor a 180 días.
- c. El animal o los animales para la competencia hípica que han estado en otro u otros países diferentes del país de origen, durante los 60 días previos al embarque no han ingresado en países afectados por las siguientes enfermedades de los equinos: Peste Equina, Encefalitis Japonesa, Muermo, Durina, Estomatitis Vesicular, Linfangitis Epizootica, Rhinoneumonitis Equina y Arteritis Viral.

Así mismo, dichos animales deberán estar amparados por Certificados Zoosanitarios expedidos por un Médico Veterinario Oficial de cada uno de los países en los que se acredite el tiempo de permanencia, el estado normal de salud y la no ocurrencia de Anemia Infecciosa Equina, Metritis Contagiosa Equina y otras enfermedades infectocontagiosas o transmisibles a la especie dentro de un radio mínimo de 30 kilómetros del lugar donde hayan estado los animales.

- d. Las fotocopias de los certificados en los literales a, b y c deben describirse en idioma español o en su caso adjuntar al original la traducción.
- e. El vehículo o los vehículos de transporte, local e internacional fueron lavados, desinfectados previo al embarque del animal o los animales.
- f. Fotocopia de la póliza de Importación del Ministerio de Finanzas Públicas.
- g. Fotocopia del conocimiento de Embarque, según sea el caso (aéreo, marítimo o terrestre)
- h. Fotocopia de la Factura Comercial, debiendo contener la siguiente información:

Los competidores que no cumplan con el Artículo 136 se les negará entrar a la pista durante la competencia.

Los Jinetes de El Salvador, Honduras, Costa Rica, y Panamá, están invitados a participar con sus propios caballos. Las caballerizas estarán abiertas para recibir a los caballos visitantes a partir del día **sábado 09 de febrero de 2019**. Agradecemos enterar al Comité Organizador de la fecha y hora de llegada de los caballos para coordinar el ingreso al país y poder facilitarles la entrada a las instalaciones donde se alojarán.

Se invita a un (1) Jinete de cada país para las categorías Debutantes, Futuros Campeones, Pre-Infantil, Amplia especial, Amplia 0.90 y Amplia 1.00, las categorías Infantil, Juvenil y Abierta 1.20 Mts. se harán por **INVITACION PERSONAL** del Comité Organizador.

Para las pruebas FEI (Infantil y Juvenil) las inscripciones deberán ser realizadas por su Federación Nacional a través del Entry System de la FEI, a más tardar el día 09 de febrero de 2019.

JINETES NACIONALES

Para Jinetes nacionales, la inscripción por binomio tendrá un valor de **\$125.00 (Ciento veinticinco Dólares Americanos)**, lo que les da derecho a participar en las fechas de competencia del Campeonato Internacional, y las Reuniones Sociales, Cóctel de Bienvenida, Fiesta de Entrega de Premios a Campeones y de Clausura del Campeonato Internacional y las

mismas deben realizarse a través de **Ecuestre Digital** y deberán ser confirmadas y canceladas a más tardar **el jueves 07 de febrero**, hasta las 17:00 horas en las oficinas de la sede del evento, ese día se les entregará un brazalete que se utilizará para todas las actividades que sean invitados. Por ningún motivo se reintegrará total o parcialmente el valor de las inscripciones recibidas. Para la Elite la inscripción para los dos días es de \$ 200, \$100 por la prueba del jueves y \$100 por la Prueba del día sábado.

Cada jinete guatemalteco (binomio) que se inscriba para este concurso podrá compartir su caballo con un jinete extranjero, el que será adjudicado en la Reunión Técnica de Jefes de Equipo. **TODOS** los caballos inscritos en las categorías **Debutantes, Futuros Campeones, PRE-INFANTIL, AMPLIA ESPECIAL, INFANTIL Y AMPLIAS** podrán, ser compartidos con los jinetes extranjeros, el Comité Organizador asignara los caballos, Podrán venir jinetes invitados para todas categorías. Siendo responsabilidad del jinete que invita el prestarle caballo al jinete invitado. Principalmente en las categorías JUVENIL, ADULTOS 1.20 mts. El jinete Debe informar al Comité Organizador de esta decisión para que éste curse la invitación correspondiente, de no optar por esta invitación por cualquier razón, el Comité Organizador tiene la capacidad de invitar a jinetes con experiencia comprobada, así mismo profesionales destacados para sugerirlos compartir sus caballos con éstos.

Los Jinetes guatemaltecos podrán inscribirse con un máximo de cinco (5) caballos por prueba.

Los Jinetes extranjeros **NO** podrán cambiar la **embocadura** y **protectores** del caballo que se les haya asignado, previo permiso del dueño del caballo o responsable del mismo.

SORTEOS

Se realizarán sorteos que determinará el orden de entrada en los primeros dos días de competencia, el primer día los jinetes nacionales ingresaran primero, el segundo día los jinetes extranjeros entraran de primero, El orden de entrada para el último día se realizará en orden contrario a las faltas o puntos acumulados es decir el último va primero y así sucesivamente. Solucionando en forma justa el tiempo de descanso de los caballos compartidos para que mantengan el mismo número de participantes de separación. Tendremos a disposición caballos de reserva en cada categoría. En el caso que por lesión de un caballo que haya sido asignado a un jinete extranjero y que por prescripción de los Médicos Veterinarios Oficiales del Evento, o por el Comité Organizador sea retirado, se procederá a remontar únicamente al Jinete extranjero, con uno de los caballos de reserva en el orden determinado previamente.

CLASIFICACIÓN INDIVIDUAL

La puntuación acumulada para la Clasificación Individual de cada binomio, en cada una de las categorías se llevará a cabo por puntos, de la forma siguiente:

1er. Lugar	No. de Participantes más 1 punto
2do. Lugar	No. de Participantes menos 1 punto
3er. Lugar	No. de Participantes menos 2 puntos
4to. Lugar	No. de Participantes menos 3 puntos
y así sucesivamente.	

El binomio de cada categoría que acumule más puntos al finalizar el concurso, será declarado "CAMPEÓN" de su categoría. De existir empate en la puntuación acumulada para "CAMPEON", "SUB-CAMPEON" y "TERCER LUGAR", se declararán los puestos de acuerdo a la clasificación de la última prueba de cada categoría.

CLASIFICACIÓN POR EQUIPOS

Los equipos estarán formados por un máximo de cuatro (4) Jinetes de una misma Nación; un Jinete por cada una de las categorías. Un país podrá participar con tres (3) Jinetes en el Equipo, en caso no logre completar los cuatro (4) participantes. Las Categorías que Puntearan para el Campeonato de Equipos son. Pre Infantil, Infantil, Amplia, y Abierta. Guatemala podrá presentar dos equipos, pero solo uno podrá ser premiado.

Para la clasificación se tomarán los tres (3) Jinetes con mejores posiciones de cada Equipo, por cada día de Competencia. La puntuación acumulada para la Clasificación por Equipos se llevará a cabo por puntos en los dos primeros días de competencia, los que se asignarán a cada Jinete que conforma Equipo en cada una de las categorías, de la forma siguiente:

El equipo que acumule más puntos será declarado "CAMPEON" al finalizar el Evento. De existir empate en la puntuación acumulada para los equipos "CAMPEON", "SUB-CAMPEON" y "TERCER LUGAR", se declararán los puestos de acuerdo al mayor número de puntos acumulados obtenidos por cada equipo en la primera y segunda prueba calificativa de las categorías que lo componen.

De persistir empate, se definirán los puestos de acuerdo al mayor número de puntos obtenidos por cada equipo en la última prueba calificativa-final de las categorías que lo componen. En última instancia, de subsistir empate, el mismo se resolverá a través de sorteo.

PROTESTAS

ENTRENAMIENTO Y CALENTAMIENTO

Los Jinetes extranjeros podrán entrenar en el caballo que se les adjudicó en el sorteo, en el lugar y horario que se asigne en la Reunión Técnica de Jefes de Equipo. Tanto el día de entrenamiento, como los días de competencia serán permitidos un máximo de seis (6) saltos. Las combinaciones de dos (2) y tres (3) esfuerzos se tomarán como un salto.

Queda estrictamente prohibido varenear durante los días del Evento. Los competidores que varenearán serán descalificados y expulsados del Evento. No se reintegrará el valor de la inscripción.

REGLAS PARA EL ÁREA DE CONCURSO

Los Jinetes deberán estar debidamente uniformados (Artículo 256 - Reglamento De Salto de la FEI), para realizar el reconocimiento de las pistas, todos los días de competencia. Los Jinetes ganadores deberán estar montados y debidamente uniformados al entrar a la pista a recibir sus premios.

Cualquier acto de descortesía, desobediencia, agresión o mal trato de un participante hacia los jueces oficiales, otros competidores o caballos, podrá tener como resultado su inmediata descalificación, mas tarjeta amarilla FEI y multa.

Una vez aceptadas sus inscripciones, los Jinetes aceptan las Reglas del Evento. El Comité Organizador se reserva el derecho de admisión.

En circunstancias excepcionales, junto con la anuencia del Jurado de Campo, al Comité Organizador se reserva el derecho de modificar el programa; para aclarar cualquier asunto que se derive de alguna omisión, ó debido a circunstancias imprevistas o de fuerza mayor. The Fédération Equestre Internationale (FEI) expects all those involved in international equestrian sport to adhere to the FEI's Code of Conduct and to acknowledge and accept that at all times the welfare of the horse must be paramount and must never be subordinated to competitive or commercial influences.

1. At all stages during the preparation and training of competition horses, welfare must take precedence over all other demands. This includes good horse management, training methods, farriery and tack, and transportation.
2. Horses and Athletes must be fit, competent and in good health before they are allowed to compete. This encompasses medication use, surgical procedures that threaten welfare or safety, pregnancy in mares and the misuse of aids.
3. Events must not prejudice horse welfare. This involves paying careful attention to the competition areas, ground surfaces, weather conditions, stabling, site safety and fitness of the horse for onward travel after the event.
4. Every effort must be made to ensure that horses receive proper attention after they have competed and that they are treated humanely when their competition careers are over. This covers proper veterinary care, competition injuries, euthanasia and retirement.
5. The FEI urges all involved with the sport to attain the highest levels of education in their areas of expertise.

4. PONIES

FEI Veterinary Regulations, Chapter IX:

For all Pony Events, Ponies must be available for Pony Measurement if requested by the FEI.

5. INJURY SURVEILLANCE

FEI Veterinary Regulations, Chapter VIII:

Horses participating in FEI Events are subject to injury surveillance protocols; and in the event of fatality, a post mortem examination.

6. TRANSPORT OF HORSES

Horses must be fit to travel and be transported in suitable vehicles for the transport of horses. Any government requirements for disease testing and control must be requested well in advance, to ensure that the horse is in compliance by the time of arrival at the border of the country where the Event is taking place. Athletes, or their representatives, have the responsibility to comply with national legislation in both their country of origin and the host nation of the Event. Where necessary athletes must contact local government authorities or veterinary advisors for information regarding animal health requirements and transport legislation. Within the European Union (EU), this includes EU Council Regulation (EC) No 1/2005 concerning the protection of animals during transport within the Member States of the EU.

7. VENUE ARRIVAL INFORMATION & FITNESS TO COMPETE

7.1. PASSPORTS. FEI General Regulations Article 137

For all issues relating to FEI Horse Passports/FEI Recognition Cards please contact your National Federation.

All Horses competing at FEI Events must be registered with the FEI.

FEI Passports or FEI Recognition Cards (for those Horses with a national passport approved by the FEI) are compulsory for FEI Events.

NB: Horses entered in CIMs and in CSIP in their country of residence are not required to have an FEI Passport or FEI Recognition Card but must be properly registered with the FEI and identifiable (GRs 137.2).

Athletes who do not present a Horse's Passport and/or Recognition Card, or one that is not correctly validated or fail to meet other passport requirements will be **subject to Sanctions in accordance with Annex VI of the FEI Veterinary Regulations** and may not be allowed to compete.

NB for Horses permanently resident in a Member State of the European Union: all Horses must have a national EU passport in compliance with EU Regulations to which a FEI Recognition card is applied. The exception to this being Horses in possession of an FEI passport which has been continually revalidated without interruption.

7.2. VACCINATIONS - EQUINE INFLUENZA. FEI Veterinary Regulations Article 1003

Horses competing at FEI Events must comply with the requirements for Equine Influenza vaccination in accordance with the Veterinary Regulations and as summarised below.

All FEI registered Horses intending to compete at FEI Events (including CIMs) must be vaccinated against Equine Influenza in accordance with these VRs. The exception being if the applicable domestic legislation prevents the use of Equine Influenza vaccines within the relevant territory

7.3. EXAMINATION ON ARRIVAL. FEI Veterinary Regulations Article 1031

On arrival at an Event venue, all Horses must undergo an examination by a veterinarian to confirm their identification from their passport and micro-chip ID (where present), their vaccination status and general health. To protect all horses attending events, any Horse with a questionable health status concerning vaccination, disease or other concerns, must be stabled within the isolation facilities provided by the Organising Committee pending a decision on entering the venue.

7.4. HORSE INSPECTIONS. FEI Veterinary Regulations Articles 1034-1042

All Horses will be assessed for their fitness to compete during the Horse Inspection. Any Horse demonstrating questionable fitness may be referred to the Holding Box for further veterinary examination. Horses not deemed fit to compete by the Inspection Panel will not be permitted to compete.

7.5. LIMB SENSITIVITY EXAMINATION. FEI Veterinary Regulations Articles 1048-1053

All Horses are subject to examination under the protocol for abnormal limb sensitivity throughout the period of an Event, including, but not limited to, between rounds and before the Jump Off. Horses may be examined once or on multiple occasions during the Period of an Event.

Horses may be selected for examination under the protocol randomly or they may be targeted. All Horses selected to be tested must submit promptly to the examination or are subject to immediate disqualification. There is no obligation to examine any specific number of Horses at an Event.

8. EQUINE ANTI-DOPING AND CONTROLLED MEDICATION PROGRAMME (EADCMP). FEI VETERINARY REGULATIONS, CHAPTER VII

8.1. SAMPLING. FEI VETERINARY REGULATIONS Chapter VII

All horses competing at FEI Events may be subject to sampling for the presence of Prohibited Substances in accordance with the Anti-Doping and Controlled Medication Regulations (EADCMRs). Horses may be selected for sampling in accordance with obligatory testing, targeted or random

sampling procedures. Refer to FEI Financial Charges for details of fees relating to Equine and Human Anti-Doping program (EADCMP), which OCs/NFs have the right to charge to the athlete (applicable for all FEI events worldwide).

8.2. ELECTIVE TESTING. FEI VETERINARY REGULATIONS ARTICLES 1058

Elective Testing may be carried out prior to an Event to check for the presence of prohibited substances. Please refer to <https://inside.fei.org/fei/cleansport/horses> for information and details.

XIII. HUMAN ANTI-DOPING

Athletes can be tested at any FEI Event, by the FEI or by other Anti-Doping Organisations with Testing jurisdiction. Organisers will have the responsibility to provide facilities and staff/volunteers to facilitate such Testing if requested by the FEI as outlined in article 22.3 of the FEI's Anti-doping Rules for Human Athletes (ADRHA).

XIV. ADDITIONAL INFORMATION

1. INSURANCES AND NATIONAL REQUIREMENTS

Equestrian sports involve inherent dangerous risks. To the greatest extent permitted by law, the FEI and the FEI Event Organiser shall NOT be liable for any damages relating to loss of property or injury of any kind to Athletes, Owners, Support Personnel or Horses at or in connection with an FEI Event and the FEI expressly excludes all such liability.

1.1. ATHLETES, OWNERS AND SUPPORT PERSONNEL

1.1.1. Personal Accident and Health Insurance

It is your responsibility as an Athlete/Owner/ Support Personnel to ensure that you have adequate personal accident insurance in place to cover your participation at FEI Events and in particular to insure against any personal injury or medical expenses arising from an accident, injury or illness which may occur at a FEI Event.

You should check with your National Federation to confirm if your National Federation's insurance policy (if any) covers personal accidents and/or illnesses which may occur when you are attending/participating in FEI Events.

If your National Federation does not have a personal accident/health insurance policy or if the National Federation's insurance policy does not cover personal accident or health claims, then you should obtain your own personal accident and health insurance policy to cover your attendance/participation at FEI Events.

1.1.2. Personal Property Insurance

You should also ensure that you are insured against property loss, theft or damage which may occur at an FEI Event.

Again, the advice is to check with your National Federation to confirm if they have an insurance policy in place which would cover you in case of such property loss, theft or damage. If not,

then you should obtain your own personal property insurance to cover such situations.

1.1.3. Press Equipment

Press equipment and other items left in the Press workroom, Press lockers, the Press Tribune or anywhere on the showgrounds are left entirely at the owner's risk. The Organising Committee does not accept any responsibility for any loss or damage to such equipment or items. Members of the Press are advised not to leave any equipment or personal items unattended.

1.2. ATHLETES AND OWNERS

1.2.1. Third Party Liability Insurance

As an Athlete/Owner you are personally responsible for damages to third parties caused by you, your employees, Support Personnel, your agents or your Horses. You are, therefore, strongly advised to take out third-party liability insurance providing full coverage in relation to FEI Events at home and abroad, and to keep the policy up to date.

The FEI and the Organiser will NOT be responsible for any damage caused to third parties by you, your employees, Support Personnel, your agents or your Horses.

1.2.2. Additional Liability Information

As an Owner you should ensure that your Horses are adequately insured against any injuries or illnesses they may sustain while participating at a FEI Event.

3. SCHOOLING DURING COMPETITIONS

Athletes wishing to school during speed competitions (Table A and Table C) must inform the OC before these competitions begin. These athletes will start first in these competitions.

4. STEWARDING

- If an athlete is uncertain as to whether the boots he/she intends to use during an event are allowed, he/she or his/her representative should show the boots to the Chief Steward for his/her opinion before the boots are used in training or in competition.
- In addition, athletes are to be made aware that hind boots must be removed and placed again on the horse's legs in the presence of a Steward while in the warm-up arena prior to entering the competition arena for certain competitions. (If bandages are used in place of boots, athletes are not required to remove the bandages in the warm-up arena.) This procedure is compulsory for competitions for which boot and bandage control is mandatory, that is the Nations Cup, Grand Prix, and the competition with the highest prize money, and is at the discretion of the Chief Steward for other competitions.
- As an alternative to carrying out this procedure at the time designated by the Steward an athlete may ask his/her groom to take the boots to the in-gate and place them on the horse's legs in front of the Steward prior to the combination entering the arena.
- The Steward has the authority to intervene if a boot is deemed excessively tight by instructing that the boot be removed and put on again correctly. *[Stewards are to note that it is normal for a horse's gait to be somewhat affected immediately after boots have been removed and re-placed.]* If an athlete or his/her groom refuses to remove and re-place the boot(s) when instructed to do so by the Steward, a Yellow Warning Card will be issued to the athlete in question.
- If it is deemed impossible or unsafe to remove the hind boots in the warm-up arena prior to the combination entering the competition arena, due to an extremely excited or nervous horse, the boots of the horse in question are to be removed by the athlete/groom following the athlete's round upon leaving the arena and inspected by the Steward. This inspection may be carried out during the boot and bandage control if the boot and bandage control is carried out for the competition in question.
- This procedure does not replace boot and bandage control after completion of an athlete's round for competitions for which boot and bandage control is mandatory (refer to JRs Art. 244.1).

5. DISPUTES

In the event of any discussion concerning the interpretation of the schedule (in translated languages), the English version will be decisive.

6. MODIFICATION TO SCHEDULE

In exceptional circumstances, together with the approval of Chefs d'Equipe, host NF delegate, if any, and the Ground Jury, the Organiser may change the schedule in order to clarify any matter arising from an omission or due to unforeseen circumstances. Any such changes must be notified to all athletes and officials as soon as possible and they must be reported to the FEI Secretary General by the Technical Delegate, the President of the Ground Jury or the Foreign Judge, as applicable.

In case of a tie for the 12th place in a competition with 12 to 48 starters, the prize money foreseen for the 12th place will be divided equally among the athletes concerned.

For Competitions run in two rounds with more than 12 starters in 2nd round:

OCs that indicate in the schedule that a specific number (that is more than 12) of athletes will return for the second round will be permitted to distribute the prize money for that competition among all the athletes taking part in the second round, even if the second round is followed by a jump-off in case of a tie on penalties for first place after the second round.

DEDUCTIONS FROM PRIZE MONEY AT COMPETITIONS:

Full details of any deductions from prize money must be outlined in the schedule. This includes government taxes. If it is necessary for Organisers to deduct such taxes, they must provide participants with an official form indicating the amount of tax deducted.

The tax form must be provided to the athletes upon arrival and returned to the Organiser prior to departing.

IMPORTANT

The total amount of prize money shown for each Competition in the schedule must be distributed. (FEI General Regulations articles 127 and 128)

For details of the prize money breakdown for each competition please refer to the tables at the end of this document; the Organiser must specify which of the two (2) tables will be used. The total prize money for the Competition must be distributed among the first twelve (12) placed athletes.

The Organiser must provide additional created prizes for athletes placed beyond twelfth (12th) place. The minimum amount for each of these additional prizes, for athletes placed from thirteenth (13th) to last place, must be clearly specified in the approved schedule and not exceed the prize money of the athlete placed twelfth (12th)

9. MAXIMUM NUMBER OF STARTERS PER COMPETITION

***Annex VI FEI Jumping Rules:**

Maximum 100 starters per Competition other than the GP. If more than 100 starters are declared, the OC must provide the following percentages of additional prize money for every ten declared starters, up to 120 declared starters:

- 101 to 110 declared starters: the OC must provide 133% of the original Competition prize money, which is to be distributed among the 16 best placed athletes in the Competition according to the prize money distribution chart I or II. The additional prize money provided by the OC is not taken into consideration with regard to the overall prize money that determines the star level of the Event or the Longines Ranking point group of the Competition, if applicable.
- 111 to 120 declared starters: the OC must provide 166% of the original Competition prize money, which is to be distributed among the 20 best placed athletes in the Competition according to the prize money distribution chart I or II. The additional prize money provided by the OC is not taken into consideration with regard to the overall prize money that determines the star level of the Event or the Longines Ranking point group of the Competition, if applicable.

If more than 120 starters are declared, the OC must split the Competition into two groups and provide 200% of the original Competition prize money which is to be divided equally between the two groups. The additional prize money provided by the OC is not taken into consideration with regard to the overall prize money that determines the star level of the Event or the Longines Ranking point group of the Competition, if applicable.

OCs may apply either of the following methods for splitting the Competition:

The competition is split into two groups before it starts. There may be athletes with multiple horses in each group but all horses of any one athlete must be in the same group. If it is not possible to have two groups of equal size there may be a different number of starters in each group;

OR

The competition is run as one single competition and split afterward into two groups and the classification established as follows: the athlete with the best score is the winner of the first group, the athlete with the second best score is the winner of the second group and so on until prizes have been allocated to 25% of the total number of starters. *NB: In this case separate results must be sent to the FEI for each of the two groups, e.g. results for Competition 1a and for Competition 1b.*

In both cases above each group must offer the same amount of prize money. For the avoidance of doubt, it is the number of declared starters in the Competition, not the final number of starters, that determines whether the Competition must be split.

If there are more than 200 declared starters, the OC must split the Competition into three groups and provide the same percentages of additional prize money as indicated above (100% of original Competition prize money to be provided for each of the three groups if each group has 100 or fewer starters; 133% of original prize money to be provided for each group if any of the three groups has 101-110 starters; 166% of original prize money to be provided for each if any of the three groups has 111-120 starters).

³ For CSI-W Events with a Grand Prix Competition in addition to the FEI World Cup™ competitions, the minimum prize money requirements indicated above for the Grand Prix apply only to the FEI World Cup™ Competition as it has the status of a Grand Prix; the Grand Prix Competition at such Events cannot offer more prize money than the prize money offered for the FEI World Cup™ Competition. Refer to the FEI Jumping World Cup™ rules for details relating to date of implementation of this rule at CSI-W Events.

10. GLOSSARY

***Glossary FEI Jumping Rules:**

Fees:

- Compulsory Fee: Compulsory Fees are fees that may be charged by the OC for costs/services not included in the Entry Fee. Compulsory Fees, if charged, must be paid by all Athletes taking part in the Event. Only the following Compulsory Fees may be charged by the OC, providing full details of the amount to be charged is included in the Schedule and approved by the FEI:
 - NF fee if applicable
 - NF medication control programme fee if applicable
 - FEI EADCMR fee if applicable (OC to indicate in the Schedule if the EADCMR fee is included in the Entry Fee or not)
 - Fee for health/customs-related documents for Horses if applicable
 - Fee for manure disposal (maximum € 40 per horse per Event)
 - Fee for lorry parking if applicable (Athletes may opt out of this fee only if they do not have a lorry at the Event)
 - Fee for electric hook-up for lorry (Athletes may opt out of this fee only if they do not have a lorry at the Event)
- Discretionary Fee: Discretionary Fees are fees that may be charged for optional commodities/services that may be purchased by an Athlete if he so chooses and that do not affect the equity of the Athlete's right to compete at the Event or the well-being of the Horse, such as:
 - VIP or premium parking
 - VIP table
 - Extra box for tack or for non-competing Horse
 - Extra bedding and/or fodder (details to be included e.g. shavings, straw, hay)
 - Premium stabling (all stabling at the Event must meet minimum FEI requirements)
- Entry Fee: The Entry Fee is the fee charged to participate in an Event with one Horse and covers the following:
 - Stabling of one Horse for the duration of the Event (includes cleaning and disinfecting stables before the event, including between Events that are part of Tours, water and

electricity in the stables, first bedding or a fixed amount of bedding depending on the type of event and 24 hour security services for the stables)

- Use of all facilities at the Event (no infrastructure fees may be charged)
- Right to participate in all Competitions in accordance with the conditions in the Schedule (no nomination fees or start fees may be charged)
- Administrative/Office fees (includes all services relating to administration of the Event and running of the Competitions: data/results/timing services, bookkeeping and accreditation services)

Failure from OCs of International Events to provide the FEI with the appropriate result(s) and/or prize money information by the aforesaid deadline and/or in the aforesaid format shall entail a warning for the first violation and thereafter a fine of CHF 1'000.- per violation.
